CHCAGE005	<p>Provide support to people living with dementia <i>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to provide person-centred care and support to people living with dementia. It involves following and contributing to an established individual plan.</i> <i>This unit applies to workers in a residential or community context, including family homes. Work performed requires some discretion and judgement and may be carried out under regular direct or indirect supervision.</i></p>	□

<p>CHCPAL001</p>	<p>Deliver care services using a palliative approach <i>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to care for people with life-threatening or life-limiting illness and/or normal ageing process within a palliative approach.</i></p> <p><i>This unit applies to workers in a residential or community context. Work performed requires some discretion and judgement and is carried out under regular direct or indirect supervision.</i></p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/></p>
<p>CHCPRP003</p>	<p>Reflect on and improve own professional practice <i>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to evaluate and enhance own practice through a process of reflection and ongoing professional development.</i></p> <p><i>This unit applies to workers in all industry sectors who take pro-active responsibility for their own professional development.</i></p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/></p>
<p>HLTAID003</p>	<p>Provide first aid <i>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to a casualty. <p>BSBCUS301</p>	<p>Deliver and monitor a service to customers <i>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to identify customer needs, deliver and monitor customer service and identify improvements in the provision of customer service.</i></p> <p><i>It applies to individuals who apply a broad range of competencies in various work contexts. In this role, individuals often exercise discretion and judgement using appropriate theoretical knowledge of customer service to provide technical advice and support to customers over short or long term interactions.</i></p> <p><i>No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.</i></p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/></p>
<p>BSBMED301</p>	<p>Interpret and apply medical terminology appropriately <i>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to understand and respond to instructions; to carry out routine tasks and communicate with a range of internal/external clients in a medical environment; as well as use appropriate medical terminology.</i></p> <p><i>It applies to individuals who apply a broad range of competencies in various medical administration contexts. They may exercise discretion and judgment using appropriate knowledge to provide technical advice and support to a team.</i></p> <p><i>No licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.</i></p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/></p>
<p>BSBWOR204</p>	<p>Use business technology <i>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to select and use computer software and organise electronic information and data.</i></p> <p><i>It applies to individuals who apply a limited range of practical skills with a fundamental knowledge of equipment use and the organisation of data in a defined context, under direct supervision or with limited individual responsibility.</i></p> <p><i>No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication</i></p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/></p>
<p>BSBWOR301</p>	<p>Organise personal work priorities and development <i>This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to organise own work schedules, to monitor and obtain feedback on work performance and to maintain required levels of competence.</i></p> <p><i>This unit applies to individuals who exercise discretion and judgement and apply a broad range of competencies in various work contexts.</i></p> <p><i>No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.</i></p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/></p>
