About the Course

ET Australia, in partnership with Adventist Senior Living (Avondale), is delivering a subsidised aged care training program designed to prepare participants for entry-level roles in residential aged care. This program will be delivered onsite at Adventist Senior Living (Avondale), combining face-to-face training with structured work placement within the Avondale residence. Participants will develop the skills, knowledge and confidence required to work effectively as part of an aged care team, supporting older people with dignity, respect and person-centred care.

Structure

This program is delivered onsite at Adventist Senior Living (Avondale) and combines classroom sessions with at least 120 hours of work placement.

Entry requirements include:

- Current volunteer NDIS Worker Screening Check, in line with legislative and Adventist Senior Living requirements

Students are required to wear the following during placement:

- Black pants (no tights)
- Black polo shirt
- Black enclosed, non-slip shoes
- ET Australia name badge

Employment Opportunities and Pathways

Potential roles of employment include Care Service Employee, Accommodation Support Worker, Assistant in Nursing, and Personal Care Assistant.

Graduates may also pursue higher qualifications such as CHC43015 Certificate IV in Ageing Support or specialised units within CHC33021.

Fees and Funding

This training is subsidised by the NSW Government, with fee-free places available for eligible participants. As places are limited, fee-free training is not guaranteed.
